CANDIDATES On Sunday, February 22nd, our R.C.I.A. candidates were presented to the Bishop Hartmayer at the Rite of Election at the Cathedral of St. John the Baptist. At that time, they reaffirm their intention to join the Church in the presence of the bishop. Next, the three Scrutinies are celebrated on the Third, Fourth and Fifth Sundays of Lent. The Scrutinies are rites of conversion and repentance and the prayers of intercession are intended to deliver the candidates from sin, protect them from temptation and invite them closer to Christ. The First Scrutiny is March 7th at 5:30 Mass, the Second Scrutiny is March 15th at 9:00 a.m. Mass and the Third Scrutiny is March 22nd at the 11:15 a.m. Mass. At the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night, the candidates are welcomed to the Lord's Table as full disciples of Christ. We invite everyone to come and witness this beautiful evening as we anticipate Christ's resurrection.




