

April 13th - Holy Thursday Mass will be celebrated at 7:00 p.m. to commemorate Our Lord's Last Supper, followed by Exposition of the Blessed sacrament. The Altar of Adoration will be set up in the Daily Chapel and will remain open until 11:00 p.m.

April 14th - Good Friday There will be Stations of the Cross at 3:00 p.m. At 7:00 p.m. there will be a Liturgical Service and Veneration of the Cross and Holy Communion. The LifeTeen youth will perform the Living Stations following the service. The Pontifical Good Friday Collection is for the Holy Land.

April 15th - Holy Saturday Anticipated Mass of the Resurrection will be celebrated at 8:30 p.m. We will welcome our R.C.I.A. candidates into the Catholic faith at this Mass. Please note: there will be NO 5:30 p.m. Vigil Mass on Holy Saturday.

April 16th - Easter Sunday Masses will be celebrated at 7:00 a.m., 8:30 a.m., 10:30 a.m. and 12:15 p.m. The Second Collection is for the Priest's Retirement Fund.
