

The offertory is the primary means of support for the parish and provides programs, support, and services to our parishioners, school, and community. If possible, please continue to send in your tithe or use online giving even though we cannot offer public Masses at this time.

On Friday, May 1st, Governor Brian Kemp directed all state agencies, without exception, to prepare for a 14% cut in their budgets. Like most states, Georgia has been experiencing a sever drop in revenues, most of which comes from taxes. In an April 20, 2020 article, James Salzer wrote in the Atlanta Journal-Constitution: "The state could face at least a \$4 billion shortfall over the next 15 months without more federal aid, likely meaning layoffs and furloughs across the government in the coming year, a new report out Monday says."

Federal aid may be coming, but even if it does we are going to face financial struggles for many,

many months.

I'm not writing this to scare anyone, but to encourage you to begin now to think a little longer-term in your own personal and household finances. In March I saw my retirement savings — a mutual fund — decline by almost 25%. I've got almost 10 years before I retire, so I'm not worried about those funds building up again. Many of you who live on investments may have seem on paper at least, a similar decline. As the state budget cuts move through our economy, there will be tough economic times for many.

Being budget-conscious is never a bad thing, but now it may be more essential. "Is this purchase necessary?" "Should we take this pretty expensive vacation or buy this new car this year, or wait one or two more?" "Can I cut back on some of the 'extras' that I enjoy – the Starbucks triple-mocha

-dolce-creamed-butterscotch grande or the lunches out each work day?"

Many economists have noted for years that too many of us have little or no savings for our use, especially in moments like the one we're living through now. Many finance professionals say we should have enough in savings to cover six months of expenses – mortgage, car payments, food, rent, utilities, etc. But many note that many folks could have a really tough time coming up with just \$1000 cash in an emergency.

Being prudent in matters of finance is necessary for all of us all the time. If this is something you haven't paid much attention to, now is the time you ought to start. Little bits of savings do add up

over time, as to little bits of spending. Make a wise choice.

Sixth Sunday of Easter The Advocate

In this weekend's Gospel Jesus tells his disciples that He will not leave the orphans. Rather, He will send the "Advocate" to be with us always.

The Advocate is, of course, the Holy Spirit. The words means "one who pleads, or one who defends, or one who calls upon." It is the Spirit whom we can call upon AND who will be our defender in those moments when we are struggling to do what Jesus says to his disciples in the Gospel: ""If you

love me, you will keep my commandments."

This weekend is opening the door for the coming feast of Pentecost, the great celebration of the descent of the Holy Spirit on the Church. We will not be able to gather as a community on May 31st. Rather we'll be gathered in our "upper rooms" still filled with concern, but in the hope that God will make His power known to us. And it is a power we very much need in times of pandemic and throughout out lives.

We need it because temptation to sin, to do what we know is against God's will for us, what is harmful to ourselves or others, is a daily reality for everyone. As a result of our "fallen" nature, we are inclined to give into these temptations for whatever temporary enjoyment or pleasure they may bring. In these moments The Advocate is waiting to be summoned, to be asked to intervene on our behalf, and to offer us the grace we need to reject the behavior we know is sinful.

On paper, it's easy. In life, not so much. But we have to keep in mind of God's offer. "If you love me, you will keep my commandments." We have to keep in mind that the Spirit given to the Apostles on Pentecost is the SAME Spirit given to us at Baptism. That Spirit makes it possible for us to do the work to which we are called – to make the saving work of Jesus Christ known to all the world.



UPDATE ON SOCIAL APOSTOLATE NEEDS

This is just to give you an update on the Social Apostolate and how things are going. Restrictions, crises, changes, happen almost on a minute to minute basis at present and things change from day to day. No clothing or thrift store donations will be accepted at this time. The need at present, since all shower and laundry facilities for the homeless are closed in the Savannah area, are for:

Baby wipes or cleansing cloths

Toilet paper

Laundry detergent PODS not liquids

Gift cards to laundromats

We ask you not to go shopping for us, but have had enquiries from so many about how you can help. We do appreciate this and in order to help you, us, and particularly the homeless, we ask that you go to the website and donate money. This is the very best way to help, even though it feels more satisfying to give goods.

We have partnered with SpinCity to provide gift cards to clients so that they can use the laundromat to wash their clothes. Hence, the need for PODS (these can easily be carried in their pocket or backpack, bottles of detergent are too heavy and bulky) – and the laundry gift cards which we can provide. \$10 will give a client the means to wash and dry 2 loads of laundry, so at least their clothes will be fresh. A bin has been placed outside the side door of the building (pull into the car park and drop the bag) for any donations you may wish to bring, please only drop off during the opening hours (above), the bin is checked frequently. Once again, we would prefer you to donate the money so that we can buy in bulk, \$10 goes a very long way when you are buying large quantities.

A BIG THANK YOU to all those who donated blood on May 4th at the K of C "Dennis Conlon THANKS! Memorial Blood Drive". We collected 50 pints of blood, which

means this drive saved up to 150 lives! Our parish did Dennis proud!! The Red Cross Blood Drive was always very close to his heart and this great result was a wonderful tribute to a very dear friend of St. Peter the Apostle Parish.
